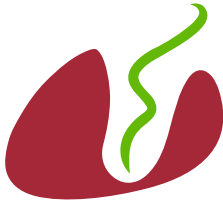

GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSIONS

MANUSCRIPTS AND EDITORIAL COMMUNICATIONS must be submitted in MSWord (2003/2007) through online submission gateway available on www.indianjournals.com. Please follow the hyperlink “**Article Submission**” on the home page of the website and upload your manuscript files following the instructions given on the screen. Queries regarding article submission can be sent at submission@indianjournals.com. Each author will be sent an acknowledgment, confirming receipt of submission. **Editorial e-mail:** Kiran Modi: iceb-journal@udayancare.org or Monisha Akhtar: monisha_akhtar@hotmail.com. Each submission should conform to APA format for manuscripts for main text and references, and be no more than 3500 words with a 500 word abstract. Please see the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, 6th Edition (2010) for APA format specifics. Submission guidelines can be located on the ICEB website at

http://udayancare.org/iceb-journal/home_iceb.html. All papers must be submitted in English. Direct initial inquiries prior to submitting a manuscript should be sent to the same e-mail addresses indicated above. Manuscripts can be submitted by any individual working with any of the following countries: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal, Sri Lanka, and Pakistan. Manuscripts can address research issues, issues of standards of care and policy, pertaining to children, out of family network, and in alternative care; legal concerns related to alternate care and management issues, home care strategies and care-giver solutions, developing monitoring systems, for children in need of care and protection, for looked after children in alternative care, as well as with special needs such as disabilities, juvenile delinquency, or children diagnosed with HIV/ AIDS. Regional and local issues can be considered. Original Articles can be accepted for publication only on condition that they are contributed solely to the ICEB journal. Authors of articles already published in foreign-language journals should communicate with the journal Editor and obtain appropriate permissions before sending manuscripts. Only then will a manuscript be considered for publication in the ICEB Journal. JOURNAL THEMES will cover a wide range of topics. From time to time, an issue may be devoted to a particular theme as in addressing mental health concerns and treating trauma in this population. Authors are encouraged to submit their ideas for particular themes and can work with the editor-in-chief to develop their ideas into a special issue. We hope to encourage creativity in thinking and promote a desire to develop new initiatives in research and care in this field.
