GENERAL ALTERNATIVE CARE NEWS INTERNATIONAL

- West Virginia's Foster Care System Faces Legal Reckoning Amid Crisis
 - West Virginia's foster care system is under intense scrutiny as the state confronts a legal battle over its handling of children in need. Allegations of systemic failures and inadequate support have sparked calls for comprehensive reforms to protect vulnerable children and improve the state's child welfare services.
- States in The USA Adopt 'Kin-First' Approach in Foster Care Reforms
 - Across The USA, states are increasingly adopting a 'kin-first' approach to foster care, prioritizing the placement of children with relatives over non-family caregivers. This shift aims to provide more stable and familiar environments for children, improving their overall well-being and maintaining family connections.
- Chard Charity 'Spark Sisterhood' Supports Female Care Leavers in Transition
 - This article talks about how The Chard-based charity 'Spark Sisterhood' is making a significant impact by aiding young women as they transition out of the care system. Through mentorship, resources, and community support, the organization empowers female care leavers to build successful, independent lives.
- Project for Adults with Learning Disabilities Expanded to Include Care Leavers
 - Shared Lives Plus, a project originally designed to support adults with learning disabilities is now being extended to assist care leavers across the UK. This expansion aims to provide tailored support and resources to young people transitioning out of care, ensuring they receive the help they need to thrive in adulthood.
- New Fund Launched to Support Business Ventures for Care Leavers at THUD Yorkshire
 - This article discusses a groundbreaking new fund that has been introduced by Hull City Council in the UK to assist care leavers in launching their own businesses. This initiative aims to provide financial backing, mentorship, and resources to young entrepreneurs, helping them achieve economic independence and success in their ventures.
- Enhanced Financial Support for Foster Parents in Indianapolis from July 1
 - Starting July 1, foster parents in Indiana will receive increased financial assistance to help cover the costs of caring for children. This enhanced support aims to alleviate some of the financial burdens faced by foster families, ensuring they can provide a stable and nurturing environment for children in their care
- ACT passes law to support care leavers until 21
 - The ACT has passed a new law extending support for care leavers until the age of 21. This legislation aims to provide continued assistance and resources to young people transitioning out of foster care, helping them achieve better outcomes in adulthood. The law includes provisions for housing, education, and employment support

• Ensuring Every Child Has Legal Status: A Vital Human Right

UNICEF Thailand highlights the critical importance of providing legal status to every child. Without legal recognition, children face numerous challenges, including limited access to education, healthcare, and protection, undermining their rights and opportunities for a better future.

• Supporting Sexually Abused Children and Youth: Guidance for Families and Communities

The Ministry of Social and Family Development (MSF) Singapore explores effective ways to support children and youth who have experienced sexual abuse, along with their families. Emphasizing a compassionate and informed approach, the article offers insights into available resources, counselling, and the importance of creating a supportive environment for healing and recovery.

• Educational opportunities provided for orphans in Takhar

A Turkish charity has established an orphanage in Taloqan, Takhar, providing education and training to 35 orphaned children. The initiative includes meals, religious studies, and supervision, with plans to support more orphans and provide separate facilities for orphaned girls.

• Unseen inheritance: Trauma of transnational adoption 'trickles down' to adoptees' children

The Odisha government has mandated a 15-day deadline for district collectors to complete Aadhar enrolment for children in childcare institutions (CCIs). With 329 registered CCIs in the state, many children lack necessary documents to enrol. This initiative aims to ensure these children can access various government schemes and improve tracking for their safety.

• Family strengthening approach towards ensuring reintegration of children restored back to their families from institutional care settings in India

This paper published in the *Scottish Journal of Residential Child Care Volume 23 Issue 1* discusses Udayan Care's Families Together (FiT) project during Covid-19, emphasizing family-strengthening to support children in India's juvenile justice system. It aims to prevent institutionalization, promote family retention, and ensure children's well-being through systematic interventions and gatekeeping measures.

• Free Loaves on Fridays

• <u>Cultural Attitudes towards Adoption: Insights from Xhosa Communities in Mthatha, South Africa</u> This research published in *Social Work/Maatskaplike Werk Volume 60, Issue 2* explores cultural attitudes towards adoption in Mthatha, Eastern Cape province, South Africa. Utilizing a quantitative approach and paper-based questionnaires, the research highlights a predominantly positive outlook on adoption within the Xhosa community, despite cultural values emphasizing familial relationships and limited legal adoption procedures.

• Guide to Fostering Assessment in England

This comprehensive study assists social workers in completing evidence-based assessments of prospective foster carers using CoramBAAF's Form F. It includes trigger questions, analysis tips, and practical tools like worksheets and checklists, making it an essential resource for new and experienced assessors alike.

• Validating the Caregiving Experiences Questionnaire in Turkish Context

This study explores the Turkish validity of the Caregiving Experiences Questionnaire (CEQ), designed to assess self-reported caregiving experiences of parents with young children within the attachment system. Administered to 339 Turkish mothers, the CEQ was confirmed as a relevant construct through Confirmatory Factor Analysis, resulting in a reliable 34-item questionnaire.

• Barriers and Pathways to Resource Utilization Among Homeless Families

This study investigates how families with young children experiencing homelessness learn about and utilize community resources (CR) and social safety nets (SN). Interviews with sixteen parents in a homeless shelter revealed a reliance on self-sourced information rather than professional assistance.

• "On an Island": Foster parent experiences of support during the COVID-19 pandemic

The study explores foster parents' experiences of social support during the COVID-19 pandemic, identifying challenges such as isolation and lack of respect, while highlighting the importance of adapted support systems and extended family.
